



Recourse for revision (reconsideration) Help Guide

1. Introduction

Summary:

This document informs about the actions that any GSPM student needs to know and be able to implement as part of the process to request a recourse for revision (reconsideration) for items on the Final or Supplementary Exam.

It is based on the Student Rules and Regulations, which may be consulted on UCI's website.





2. Procedure

2.1 Every student has the right to review his/her exam once the time frame to complete it is over.

2.2 If, after reviewing the result of an examination, you consider, with proper and sufficient justification, that an exam item was inappropriately formulated or configured, you have the option to request a revision of this item to the facilitator. The request has to be based on reasons and bibliography.





2. Procedure

2.3 The student will have two working days, after the exam is closed, to submit the recourse for revision.

2.4 After this time frame is over, the facilitator has three business days to review the requests and decide whether they are accepted or rejected.

2.5 The facilitator will include, in the section to submit the recourse for revision, a comment to each recourse sent, with the explanations of the accepted or rejected requests. He/she will notify the Academic Assistant about any corresponding modification of grades in the campus (if necessary).





2. Procedure

2.6 After the grades are modified, the facilitator will send a notification on the News Forum of the course, informing that the recourses of revision have been resolved.

2.7 If an adjustment is done in the item, implying a change in the grades, it will apply for all the students of the cohort.

2.8 Please remember that this procedure has to be taken responsibly. This option doesn't represent an "alternative way" to improve your grade.





3. When a recourse for revision might not be accepted?

3.1 When the justification of the recourse for revision is subjective, not sufficiently clear, not well substantiated.

3.2 When the recourse for revision is submitted after the deadline: two working days after the exam is closed.

3.3 When any recourse for revision is not submitted through the "Recourse for revision" section.

3.4 When the entire item to be revised is not added in the "Recourse for revision" section.

Recourse for revision

What is a recourse for revision?

A recourse for revision is defined as a request from the student for the review of a particular exam item.

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4. What should a student do if he/she is not in agreement with the resolution of the recourse for revision?

The Student Rules and Regulations document states the following:

"If no response is produced on behalf of the professor, or the student disagrees with the professor's resolution, the student may raise, within the next five working days from the date of the professor's resolution or the date when he or she should have responded, a written appeal, properly reasoned, through the means established by the University, delivering the necessary proofs for his/her position, to the Academic Program Coordinator or the Dean, who will ultimately decide within five working days counted from the day after receiving the appeal or in an additional period of time if so required. This is the final appeal resource"
